Whittle-Le-Woods CIL Monies (Community Infrastructure Levy)

This is a tax paid by building developers to Chorley Borough Council, which is distributed via the local Council (Parish). CIL Money can be utilised by the Parish Council to enhance infrastructure (which is defined as transport facilities; flood defences; schools and other educational facilities; medical facilities; sporting and recreational facilities, and open spaces).

This year, 2018 to 2019 the Council has provided CIL monies to the following projects:

- A contribution to a ride on mower for Whittle-Le-Woods Cricket Club & Whittle-Le-Woods Playing Field Trust - the fields can now be mowed professionally when needed, and this also reduces the cost to the Parish for paying for the fields to be mowed.
- St Chads Primary school to enable the provision of pedestrian access to the school grounds, a much needed and considerably safer route for children.
- A secure door for the storage unit for Whittle-Le-Woods Scouts & Guides Groups
- Whittle-Le-Woods Primary School will benefit from a new track on the playing field as a part of their 'mile a day' initiative.

A contribution to the refurbishment of the Delph Way play area in collaboration with Chorley Borough Council

- A contribution to St Chads Primary schools new outdoor learning area.
- The Council will continue to seek out projects which will benefit our whole community which can be funded by CIL Monies



Four years ago it became apparent that St John's Parish Club in Preston Road was no longer financially sustainable.

Much work was required on the walls and roof and there were no funds available.

The club's constitution drawn up by Carlton Cross in 1898 stated that when the building became unsustainable it should be sold and the proceeds used for the fabric of St John's Church.

So the trustees approached the Whittle surgery to ask if they would be interested in buying the plot for a new and much-needed premises.

It seemed simple enough, but it has taken four years of detective work and discussion between various parties to get to the point where it can now happen.

Chorley Borough Council has bought the land, with a view to building a new surgery, and the funds released can now be used for renovation work and improvements to St John's Church.

On both counts this is good news for our community as we desperately need an expanded and purpose built Doctors Surgery and the Church will be much better suited to continue to serve the community in the decades to come.

Cricket Club Update

Once again the new Cricket Season is upon us with the club again fielding 4 teams in the 2019 Palace Shield Competition, a 1st XI, 2nd XI and most importantly two junior sides an U11s and a joint U14 side with Walton-le Dale. The club committed to the English Cricket Boards National Initiative called All Stars Cricket aimed at 5 to 8 year olds and as last year the aim is of fun and enjoyment for all and to encourage more children to try playing cricket. From small beginnings two years ago with 12 participants it has grown to 39 this year and started on Saturday 11th May at 10 am on the cricket ground. The attached photograph shows many of the children and parents at the first session. From previous years feedback all the Children and Parents enjoyed the program of events which last approximately 1 hour each week and will be running for 8 weeks. The first and second teams in divisions 1a and 5 respectively of the Palace Shield have started reasonably with both teams winning and losing in their first few games. The first under 10 matches was at home against Leyland which saw us lose a close match with both sides thoroughly enjoying the experience.

As always we are looking for players so if you fancy a game or wish to restart a career then why not come down to senior net practice on Thursday nights and speak to



either Christopher McMahon first XI captain or Ian Brook second XI captain.

There are matches every Saturday weather permitting on the Kem mill ground until mid-September so come down and enjoy a relaxing afternoon watching cricket and supporting your local club.



Football News!

The season started early last year, with games kicking off in mid-August. Over the last few years we have lost games being played from January to April, due to the bad weather.

The season had a slow start with a couple of wins but four losses, which were hampered by a number of mid-week fixtures which are always difficult, as night games are usually played on a Thursday evening. Trying to travel to Warton or Garstang on a Thursday night, with a 6.30 KO is never easy. Once the night games where out of the way, and we were back to playing Sunday mornings, the results started to pick up. One of the main reasons for this, was we were able to pick up a number of new younger players from the village. With the extra 5 new players and the squad we already had, we went on a run of 8 consecutive wins, propelling us up the table and playing some fantastic football at the same time. At this point we were 3rd in the league and going well. As for the cups this season, the 1st cup games where played on over the August bank holiday, and due to the number of players that were missing, we were unable to field a team and unfortunately had to forfeit the game, which also meant that we were unable to participate in the other cup competition, due the league rules.


As we progressed into December the usual issues due to weather started to cause havoc with the fixtures. Due to the early start of the season, by the time the new year had come around, we only had 5 games left. With a bit of luck, we could have the season finished by the end of February. unfortunately, the weather had a different idea, with us only playing are 1st game this year in early march. As the season resumed in March, we had lost a bit of the impetus of playing regularly that we had on the run up to Christmas. A couple of wins, a draw and a couple of losses in our final games, left us finishing 7th out of 12 in league 1 of the Preston Sunday League. When you compare to last season, when we were promoted to this league and manged to just avoid relegation, it was a step in the right direction, with just 4 points separating 7th and 4th place.

Just at this moment, work should be starting on our pitch, to level the surface and also create a new car park in front of the existing changing rooms. This will massively improve the surface for us to play on and hopefully increase the number of games we can play during the winter months.


