Whittle-Le-Woods Playing Field Trust: Pitch update

Liaising closely with Chorley Borough Council work to carry out a major overhaul improve the football pitch at the Playing Fields started mid-June. The project has cost £70,000, and in summary the work has involved the total replacement of the drains, and then the laying of the new pitch including sand, soil, level and seed. The main work was completed at the start of August.

The pitch has needed to be left to grow, and has now been cut 5 times, The contractors advise that the ground will not be suitable for walking on until at least the New Year, the area will then be assessed going forward. The longer it can be left then the better established the pitch will be to support all matches going forward.

Outstanding work still to be completed on the Playing Fields will be to spread 100 tonnes of sand, vertidrain the pitch, and any remedial repairs.

We thank everyone for their patience and support while the field settles along with the grass rooting properly plus the drainage system settling also.

We await further inspection from the company in view to the settlement of the field in the new year and it may be March/April before it is open.

Whittle-Le-Woods Parish Council CIL Monies (Community Infrastructure Levy)

This is a tax paid by building developers to Chorley Borough Council, which is distributed to the local Community via the local Parish Councils.

CIL Money can be utilised by the Parish Council to enhance infrastructure (which is defined as transport facilities; flood defences; schools and other educational facilities; medical facilities; sporting and recreational facilities, and open spaces).

Over the last 2 years the Council has provided CIL monies to the following projects:

- Flood Risk Assessment for Whittle-Le-Woods which provides important information on how to best protect the areas at risk both now and in the future.
- St Chads Primary School has benefitted from the provision of tablets to assist students with home learning during the pandemic, but will also enhance the IT infrastructure of the School
- Whittle-Le-Woods Primary School has benefitted from the provision of tablets to assist students with home learning during the pandemic, but will also enhance the IT infrastructure of the School
- Flood Risk Assessment Review with regard to the proposed Town Lane Development. This document along with a Highways Impact Assessment report procured by the Parish Council has assisted in providing a very strong case for objecting to the planning application
- Whittle Scouts Group have benefitted from new tables and trolley to renew the infrastructure in their building.
- Astley & Buckshaw Football Club asked Whittle-Le-Woods Parish Council for assistance in purchasing goals for their junior teams to allow the club to expand.
- Whittle Wanderers Football Club have been working hard to improve the amenities at the Whittle-Le-Woods Playing field. The Parish Council have assisted in purchasing a set of full sized goals for use when the new pitch is completed.

The Council will continue to seek out projects which will benefit our whole community which can be funded by CIL Monies.

CIL projects are considered each quarter by the Parish Council to ensure available funds are distributed fairly and responsibly.



Leyland & Chorley hockey club is based in Buckshaw Village and comprises of two ladies and two gents' teams as well as a large junior section for girls and boys aged 7-15. Our club caters for all ages and abilities, in fact our oldest player is 71!

Hockey is perhaps not the first sport that children are drawn to as most schools tend to promote sports such as netball and football but it really is a fantastic alternative for those children who perhaps just want to try something different.

It is a great way to build confidence especially in those little ones who may need it most.

Hockey is a great form of exercise and since it is a team sport, children who play learn the value of working with others. Playing on a hockey team gives little ones the experience of team spirit and encourages responsibility, trust and sportsmanship which extends into adulthood as teammates become co-workers, coaches become bosses and teams become the companies that they work for.

Leyland & Chorley hockey club recently benefitted from a grant from Whittle-Le-Woods Parish Council to purchase new goals and allow the club to grow.

It's not expensive to get started, all your child will need is a mouth guard and some shin pads, we have lots of sticks to loan so there is no need to pay for one until you know they are going to 'stick' at it.

Our weekly training sessions take place on Sunday mornings from 10.30-12pm for age 10+ and from 11-12pm for ages 7-9 years on the Astro pitch at Buckshaw Village. It costs just £2.50 per player on a pay per play basis but we would encourage anyone who is interested to come and try hockey for free.

WHITTLE-LE-WOODS & CLAYTON-LE-WOODS WAR MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

The first meeting of the War Memorial Committee was held on the 3rd March 1926 in the Bungalow Tea Rooms, (now the Doctor's Surgery), Preston Road, Whittle-le-Woods. It was attended by six Members when a Chairman and Secretary were appointed and it was agreed that a Minute Book, Cash Book and Precept Book should be purchased. (We are still using the same Minute Book today).

Since then, regular meetings have taken place each year and in 1989 Councillor Eric Bell was appointed as Chairman and continues in that role currently. The Secretary, Mrs Eileen Whiteford was appointed in 1983 and she too continues in the same role. The Committee consists of six Councillors - three from Whittle-le-Woods Parish Council and three from Clayton-le-Woods Parish Council.



The War Memorial grounds continue to be managed by the War Memorial Committee and DWG Groundwork undertakes the grass cutting and general maintenance of the grounds and car park. The flower beds are planted up each Spring and Autumn and there are various seats to relax in a lovely, quiet environment. Currently, a tree survey is being undertaken to inspect damaged and dead trees.

An Annual Remembrance Service is held in November each year although, due to the current Covid restrictions, this has had to be a scaled down event to comply with the regulations and safety issues involved. Wreaths are laid and crosses are sited around the Cenotaph with our local Vicar, the Reverend Venables from St. John's Church, leading the Service including the reading of the 128 names of the soldiers lost in the two World Wars.

The War Memorial Committee endeavour to ensure that the grounds are kept in a lovely condition which continue to be a popular place to visit and enjoy.

There are graves in our three Churches of War dead from both Wars and crosses are also placed on each grave.

Whittle & Clayton-le-Woods Cricket Club: 2021 Season Activities and Update

Thankfully the 2021 season was able to be a full program for the cricket club after the disruption caused by COVID-19 meant a vastly reduced 2020 schedule.

Our Saturday team, led by Captain Edward O'Donnell, enjoyed a full calendar of 20 league fixtures managing to win 8 matches during the season. With a massive 6 games lost due to erratic British summer weather, the team were left wondering what might have been after finishing 4th in division 5 of the Palace Shield. Captain O'Donnell accumulated the most runs and wickets for the Saturday 1XI. The away fixture at Bretherton saw a season best bowling performance of 7-24 from Shoeb Ghantiwala as he tore through the opposition.

The new Sunday side enjoyed 11 fixtures this year. Led by Captain Guy Barker, the side managed 3 wins but more importantly created a fun and enjoyable atmosphere in which to welcome the club's younger players as they progress from junior cricket to senior cricket. Anas Patel amassed 354 runs (including a devastating top score of 119 at Mawdesley) to win the Sunday batting statistics. Jonathan Cowell took the most wickets, totalling 13 including 4-36 in a tough game against Preston. Joseph Collier (a young man who has worked his way up through our junior section) had equal best figures, taking 4-36 against Gregson Lane.

2021 allowed the resumption of our junior section with regular training enjoyed on a Monday night. Led by Coach Stuart Barnish, a regular group of over 15 youngsters enjoyed a fun atmosphere in which to learn and improve their cricketing skills. The club was happy to welcome new faces to the juniors including 3 of our older All Stars/Dynamos, showing the club's commitment to provide progression for all our younger players.

The national All Stars Cricket (ASC) returned to Kem Mill Lane in 2021, with the club welcoming 35, 5 to 8 year-olds to the weekly Saturday morning sessions. Once underway, we were thankful that the weather largely co-operated and allowed the All Stars to thoroughly enjoy learning the basics of the great game of cricket.

Dynamos Cricket was a new addition to the club in 2021. The ECB national programme is for 8 to 11 year-olds and provides a natural and fun progression from ASC. The club welcomed 24 young players to the new programme, all of whom enjoyed 8 sessions during which they learnt new cricketing skills, played matches, swapped collectable cards from The Hundred and made new friends.

The club is indebted to our small but dedicated group of volunteers for facilitating so much cricket for so many people. Particularly for providing all of the fun and capacity for the 75+ under 18's who played in the juniors/Dynamos/All Stars in 2021.

One thing is certain, to maintain such high engagement with so many keen youngsters requires a growing volunteer base. The club are actively looking for new persons to join our rapidly expanding setup. Without which, there is no guarantee we can continue to provide for so many young and enthusiastic young cricketers.

If you have the desire to make a difference and can offer your time (even an hour or two a week!) please get in touch and we can discuss how you could really help your local cricket club.

The club would especially like to hear from anyone who could help with the following:
