Parish Council Meetings

Minutes of previous meetings can be accessed at Clayton Green and Chorley libraries, viewed on Chorley Borough Council's pages for Whittle-le-Woods Parish Council, or on the Parish Council website.

Whittle-Le-Woods CIL Monies (Community Infrastructure Levy)

This is a tax paid by building developers to Chorley Borough Council, which is distributed via the local Council (Parish). CIL Money can be utilised by the Parish Council to enhance infrastructure (which is defined as transport facilities; flood defences; schools and other educational facilities; medical facilities; sporting and recreational facilities, and open spaces).

This year, 2019 to 2020 the Council has provided CIL monies to the following projects:

- Whittle-Le-Woods Primary School have benefited from a new track on the playing field as a part of their 'mile a day' initiative.
- A contribution to the refurbishment of the Delph Way play area in collaboration with Chorley Borough Council.
- A contribution to St Chads Primary schools new outdoor learning area.
- The purchase of a set of Goals for Leyland and Chorley Hockey Club, who are based at Buckshaw sports fields.
- The purchase of a defibrillator (for Community use) to be installed at St Chad's Parish Centre.

The Council will continue to seek out projects which will benefit our whole community which can be funded by CIL Monies.

CIL projects are considered each quarter by the Parish Council to ensure available funds are distributed fairly and responsibly.

Whittle-Le-Woods Primary School





The former dilapidated goals were considered not fit for purpose and the club applied for a grant from Whittle-le-Woods Parish Council to add a new set whilst the others went through repair.

The hockey club have six senior teams and a thriving junior section, many of which live within the Parish. The new goals will allow the club to provide better training and to host 7-a-side tournaments for junior teams which was previously not possible.

To celebrate, the club held its first tournament, playing host to Preston Hockey Club, with matches at U8, U12 and U14 level. For many of the children this was their first real match and it was great to see the goals in use and so many children playing a team sport they so clearly enjoy.

Junior Head Coach Keith Gradwell said "the support that Whittle-Le-



Woods Parish Council has given the club is fantastic for hockey and our club in general. Getting our own goals was something we'd looked into, but to fundraise would have taken us two years. We'd like to thank the Parish Council for enabling us to get these now and the benefits the children will get are here now, not in the future.

Cricket Club Update Autumn 2019

The Cricket club's senior teams both had successful seasons in the Palace Shield with the 1st team playing for the first time in its history in division 1a and finishing a credible 8th. The 2nd team finished 3rd in division 5 and just missing out on promotion to division 4 of the Palace Shield. There were some notable performances, with Irfan Patel's 299 runs for the 1st team at an average of 24.92 and Hamza Arshad's 5 wickets for 30 runs being the pick of the bowling performances in the first team. The 2nd team's batting was won by Stuart Barnish with 280 runs averaging 40.00 and his 25 wickets at an average of 5.6 including a best of 7 wickets for 6 runs saw him win the player of the season in the second team.

The club continued to run two junior teams an under 10 side and a joint under 13 side with Walton-le-Dale both in the Palace Shield junior divisions. Between them the teams played some 15 matches with some being cancelled due to weather conditions. Both teams performed better than last season with both the U10's winning four matches. In both cases the teams showed a marked improvement over last year thanks mainly to the coaching of Stuart Barnish, Guy Barker, Stephen Straughton and helper John Bannister. Some of the under 13 players are showing some real promise and have started to playing occasional matches in the second team. In order to continue this improvement the club is going to run a team in the Palace Shield's Sunday league with the sole aim of developing future players.

The Club continued to run the English Cricket Boards All Stars Cricket initiative for children between 5 and 8 to come down and have fun with their parents along with learning some cricket skills. From the first year's 10 participants, 40 children including most from last year signed up to the 8 week program of enjoyable learning experiences. The children grew in confidence with bat and ball, learned new skills and above all make new friends and have fun. The club is hopeful that we will be able to run an u10 softball team this coming season primarily from those all stars that wish to continue to play cricket. The club is committed to running the All Stars initiative next year so why not bring your children down and give it a try. A quick thankyou here to all the parents who brought their children down, along with the guys mentioned above as well as Ian Brooke, Alex. Frater who helped run the All Stars and Amanda Barnish who served refreshments

for the parents and All Stars.

And finally a huge thank-you to all helpers who gave their time in preparing wickets, cutting the

outfield, making refreshments, doing sundry repairs and fund raising without which it would be difficult to operate.
